# Four Neighborhoods Awarded City of OKC Partnership Grants

This spring, four Oklahoma City neighborhoods were awarded funding through the City of Oklahoma City's Neighborhood Partnership Grant Program. The program allows neighborhood groups to pledge volunteer time, supplies and professional services to match cash grants for projects such as gateways or lighting. Grants can also be used for neighborhood projects such as graffiti cleanup and prevention, crime patrols, community gardens and landscaping.

The Neighborhood Partnership Program is open to incorporated neighborhood groups representing low- to moderate-income neighborhoods as defined by the 2000 Census.

## Spring 2008 Recipients:

**Classen's North Highland Parked Neighborhood (NE 16th Place/NE 13th Street/Oklahoma/Stiles) - \$10,000 for decorative lighting and identity signage**

**Classen-Ten-Penn Neighborhood (NW 16th/NW 10th/Classen-Western/Penn) - \$10,000 for decorative lighting and identity signage**

**Culbertson Neighborhood (East Drive between Phillips and Kelley) - \$10,000 for decorative lighting**

**South Park Estates Neighborhood (NE 50th/Springlelake/MLK/Kelley) - \$10,000 for gateway signage**

While these particular projects are similar, grants are not limited to lights and signs. Past projects have included bike racks for downtown, a plaza at an elementary school, and a neighborhood crime prevention awareness campaign. So, start the wheels a turnin' to find out what project your neighborhood can accomplish!
